

- 4) We also need to be very mindful of children close to the roads during our parades. As many of you have seen, some parents don't think it's a big deal for their child to come out onto the street to see something or
 - pick up some candy. (People still insist on throwing candy out to the kids which promotes this) Please stay alert and drive slowly! I know our Parade Marshal does a great job keeping folks up off the streets, but he can't cover the entire parade at one time.






