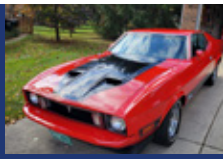

August "Safety Tip": BACKING OUT / PARKING

- 1) Before you back out of a driveway or parking spot, prevent back overs by walking around your vehicle to check for children running and playing. Even if using backup cameras, kids and pets may be out of view but still in your vehicle's path.
- 2) When children play, they often don't pay any attention to cars and trucks around them. They think drivers will watch out for them.
- 3) Every vehicle has a blind zone. As the size of the vehicle increases, so does that blind zone.
- 4) We also need to be very mindful of children close to the roads during our parades. As many of you have seen, some parents don't think it's a big deal for their child to come out onto the street to see something or pick up some candy. (People still insist on throwing candy out to the kids which promotes this) Please stay alert and drive slowly! I know our Parade Marshal does a great job keeping folks up off the streets, but he can't cover the entire parade at one time.

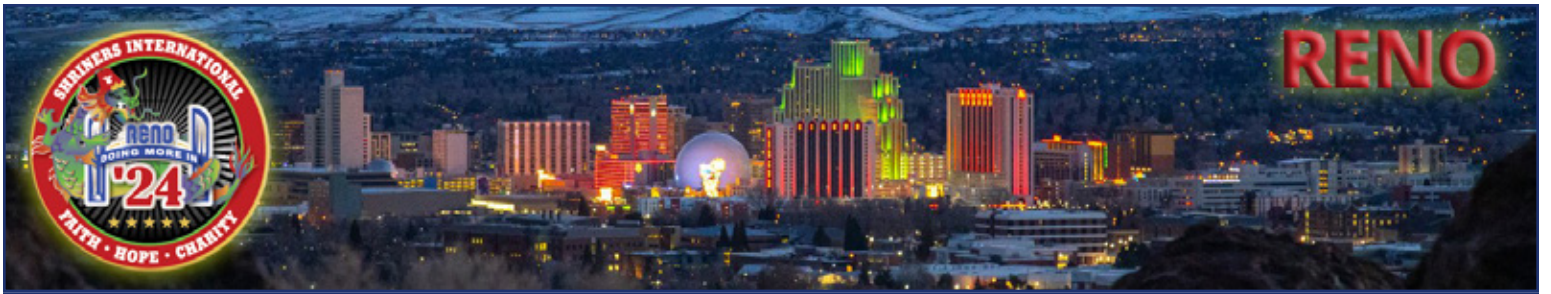
