At the Imperial Session this year, the Representatives voted to increase the Per Capita tax to \$50 per year from the \$30 it had been. This increase is effective with the 2024 dues cycle. If you elect to pay your lifetime Per Capita prior to Dec 31st, 2023, you can still get it for \$900. After that the price goes to \$1500.

This will require you to do the math and see if it is worthwhile for you. Younger Nobles I would say yes it does, as you get older you will need to do the math on how long it will take to make the difference, plan accordingly.

To be part of the group that has cared for over 1-1/2 million children throughout our system of hospitals and treatment centers putting that smile back on a kid's face. If you want to be part of that piece of the Shrine system here is your chance.

With **Shriners Children's Ohio (SCO)** right here in Dayton, you have the opportunity to help families every day and welcome them to our great city of Dayton. Show them a piece of Ohio hospitality and shuttle them to and from SCO, or be part of the larger picture and transport families to our Lexington, Chicago or St Louis facilities.

Here is what our current year in transportation looks like through August:

Current local transport to SCO 104 Prorated yearly 140-150

*just added transporting to tutoring services 2 times a week will add 110-120

Transports to other Shrine Hospitals Chicago, Lexington, and St Louis currently 13 prorated yearly **20-25**. This includes assisting Zenobia Shriners with a Chicago patient they can't transport.



We also cover the expense of the family that transports themselves to a hospital. We have 2 one each that goes to Philadelphia & Greenville.

Since 2019 these trips to other hospitals have covered **over 28,000** miles mostly by one driving team.

We currently have received 8 International patients that have been flown in by air ambulance from other countries. We expect this number to exceed 20-25 in 2024 with the new craniofacial partnership program, in partnership with Dayton Childrens.

How do you become part of the transport team? How can you help a family that comes to **YOUR** Hospital? **WE NEED YOU!!** CAN YOU BE THAT PERSON(S)? An introductory meeting will be held on Monday October 16th, 6:30pm with appetizers served.

Sign up to be a Transport Driver, or Transport Rider. It only takes some of your time. All days and hours are available. You can email or call Dawn (antioch@antiochshrine.com or 937-461-4740) in the office to be added to the list to be contacted.


