At the Imperial Session this year, the Representatives voted to increase the Per Capita tax to \$50 per year from the \$30 it had been. This increase is effective with the 2024 dues cycle. If you elect to pay your lifetime Per Capita prior to Dec 25th 2023, you can still get it for \$900. After that the price goes to \$1500.

This will require you to do the math and see if it is worthwhile for you. Younger Nobles I would say yes it does, as you get older you will need to do the math on how long it will take to make the difference, plan accordingly.














Dear Nobles and Ladies,




