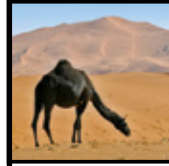

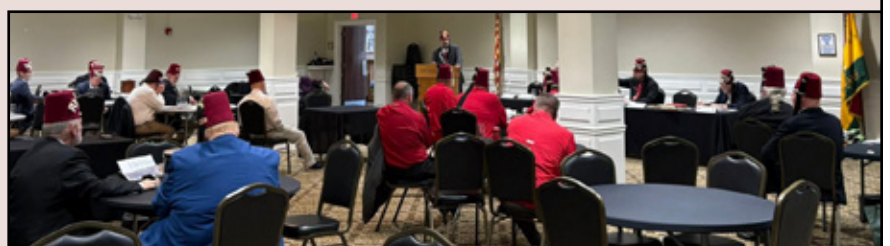
OHIO SHRINE ASSOCIATION: UNITED IN FELLOWSHIP & PHILANTHROPY

LEGION OF HONOR

Shiloh Church Veteran's Memorial Service, Sunday of Memorial Day weekend every year.

The annual Shiloh Church Veteran's Memorial Day service was my first active-duty task as an Antioch Legion of Honor (LOH) Noble within an Antioch event in May 2002.

At that time, an older gentleman, Noble Wilbur Ogg, was a long-time member of the Shiloh church parish and an Antioch Shrine LOH Past Commander. Wilbur took great pride in Antioch's LOH opening the Shiloh Veteran's Memorial ceremony on Sunday morning of Veteran's Day weekend. The service began with the Paster doing the greeting and explanation of the veteran's memorial service, and he would explain importance of honoring our veterans. He would then express his appreciation for Antioch's LOH participation, and pass the service over to the Director of the LOH to begin. The LOH would walk each branch flag down the aisle when the organist began playing the theme song for each branch in order by the branch age, oldest to newest, Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, and Space Force. The veterans who served in that branch were asked to stand in recognition of their service. After the branch flags were presented onto the alter, our National Anthem would be played as the LOH brought the county flags where Shriners Hospital's for Children exist, US, Canadian, and Mexico, down to the alter.

After the nation and branch flags were presented, the LOH would take their seats as the Antioch Potentate and the LOH Director would present the Veterans Memorial Wreath while Taps plays.

At the conclusion of the service, the LOH would retire the military branch flags and the country flags back out to the church lobby. The LOH Nobles would then line up to stay as the members of the service departed the church. Many of the church members would thank the LOH for their service and participation in the Shiloh service.

Nobles and Ladies:

As you know, Shriners Hospitals for Children provide specialized care in orthopedics, cleft lip and palate, and burn treatment. Within this network are four dedicated burn hospitals across the United States, including **Shriners Children's Ohio. (SCO)**

I would like to highlight a critical difference between orthopedic and burn care. Orthopedic procedures, while life-enhancing, are typically not life-threatening and can be scheduled in advance, allowing time to coordinate and fund transportation. In contrast, severe burn injuries are often life-threatening emergencies where time is absolutely critical delays in treatment can mean the difference between life and death.

Currently, while Shriners Hospitals for Children can provide funding for emergency international transportation, federal regulations prevent those same funds from being used for patients within the United States. This creates a significant challenge. When a child in the U.S. suffers severe burns and needs immediate transportation to one of our facilities, the hospital staff contacts the local Chairman of the Board of Governors who then must begin contacting multiple Shrine Temples to request financial support. This process is not only complex and time-consuming, but it also often results in only partial funding, requiring even more outreach.

Unfortunately, this delay can have devastating consequences. Recently, **SCO** received a call regarding a critically burned child in need of emergency air transport. While efforts were underway to secure funding, the child tragically passed away before transportation could be arranged. Air ambulance services, which are often necessary in these cases, can cost upwards of \$39,000-\$50,000 making rapid funding essential.

To address this urgent need, **The Antioch Shrine Foundation** is an established and separate 501(c)(3) organization. One of its missions is to provide funding for the transportation of critically burned domestic children to **Shriners Children's Ohio**. With this fund in place, we can act without delay—ensuring that child receives life-saving care as quickly as possible. After transportation is secured and the child is receiving treatment, this fund also helps with SOC family transportation.

This approach allows us to prioritize what matters most: saving burn children lives. With that in mind, we would like to respectfully ask you also consider making a gift to **The Antioch Shrine Foundation Hospital Transportation Fund**.

As a donor you win twice! Your donation is also **Tax Deductible**, and provides immediate life-threatening transportation for a burn child and their family to **Shriners Children's Ohio**. You don't have to donate one lump sum. Consider a pledge of as little as ten dollars a month or a Memorial Donation in the name of a friend or loved one. 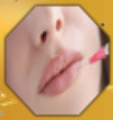

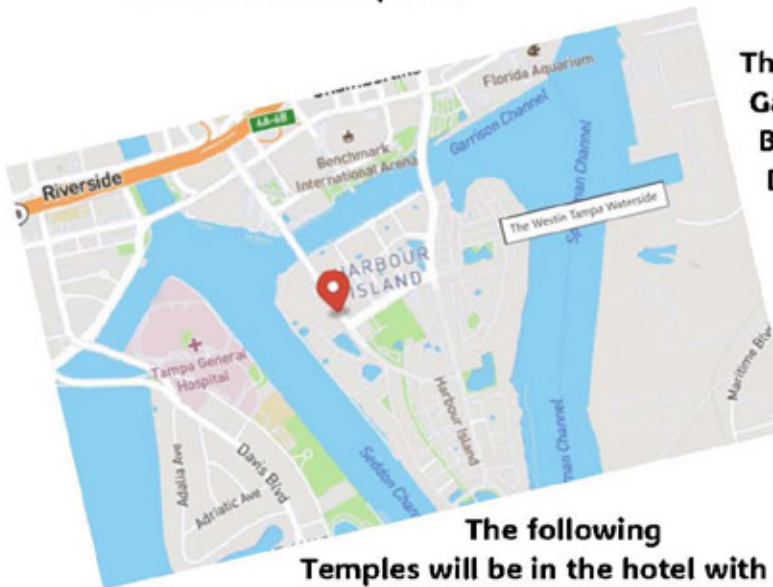


